Form	You will create a numbered or bulleted set of survival tips, written in complete sentences with explanations and reasoning for each tip.		
Focus Correction Areas	 4-6 tips in logical order/command + reasoning 5 or more specific words (or 5 or more content vocabulary), underlined Complete sentences, bulleted or numbered 		
Procedure	 To help you create your survival guide, we will do the following: Type One Writing (choose one of the following): We will all be writing a survival guide for our current content, "How to Survive" In one minute, list as many vocabulary words as you can think of (at least 6) that relate to the topic selected. You will choose a personal area of expertise for your survival guide. In two minutes, make a list of topics that you could consider yourself an expert on. You may use the list provided for inspiration. We will look at examples of survival guides (or I will model writing one) and make note of the format and content. We will view examples of writing that demonstrate each Focus Correction Area (FCA). Using a T chart: On the left side, briefly map out each tip that you will include in your guide. On the right, note the reasons for each tip. After you have finished, compare your list with a partner and look for areas that need more detail or clarification. Draft your survival guide, beginning with a title that clearly identifies the topic, i.e., "How to Survive" As a class, we will complete the Three Step Editing process, using volunteer papers and/or examples I have collected in past years. You will show me that you have followed each of the FCAs (e.g., Number your tips in the margin if they are not already numbered. Label the command (C) and reason(s) (R) for each. Underline your specific or content vocabulary.) Finally, you will read your writing out loud in a one-foot voice, and make any changes you think will improve it. Submit your revised survival guide so I can provide feedback on each FCA.
