practicing text-based analysis. Click here for quick tips to get you started and a go-to list of questions you can use as you help students develop this sophisticated skill. These and other text-dependent questions can stand alone as quick and informal Type One or Two responses that prioritize comprehension and other reading skills, or they can be structured as Type Three assignments using FCAs that combine reading response with other key writing skills.

Capture Ideas

Type 1

How well does the title support the theme of the passage? Explain in 4 lines or more.

Respond Correctly

Type 2

Identify two pieces of text evidence that help the author support his claim.

Edit for FCAs Type 3 Explain how the character changes throughout the text.

- FCA 1: Restate and briefly summarize how the character changes (15 pts.)
- FCA 2: Cite and explain two pieces of text evidence that illustrate this change (40 pts.)
- FCA 3: Use quotation marks correctly and capitalize character names (5 pts.)


